**Subject:-** Grant of LoP (Letter of permission) to Bal Bhagwan Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Dhanwantari Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, Degloor Road, Udgir, Distt. Latur-413517 (AYU0189) in respect of the application vide ref. no. DAMRU/5198/2024 dated 14.08.2024 received for seeking permission of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of Medicine, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of the NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2025-26--reg.

Sir/Madam,

- I am to refer to your application/scheme vide ref. no. DAMRU/5198/2024 dated 14.08.2024 received from The Principal, Bal Bhagwan Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Dhanwantari Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, Degloor Road, Udgir, Distt. Latur-413517 (AYU0189) on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching and practical training for increase intake capacity from 60 seats to 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course from the academic session 2025-26, the college was visited on 21.07.2025 and 22.07.2025 on hybrid mode for issuance of the letter of intent (LoI) by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) and letter of intent was issued to you vide letter of even no. dated 18.08.2025 for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of the NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2025-26.
- The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) again carried out an inspection of the institution on 02.09.2025 and 03.09.2025 through Hybrid mode. The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.

**1) Teaching staffs:-**

- a) Availability of total teaching staff for increase in intake capacity from 60 seats to 100 seats UG ( BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is  $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{23}{24} \times 100\% = 97.05\% \%$  (Excluding Excess)



- Thereafter, the assessment report and all other related documents were placed in the 148<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 25.09.2025 and Board decided to issue Letter of Permission (LoP) for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of the NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2025-26 along with the condition for fulfillment of teaching staff as mentioned above within 01 month of issuance of this letter.
- Further as per NCISM Act 2020 and as per Table 18 of Regulation 70(1) of notified Regulations namely the "Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", a letter was sent to you vide letter of even no. dated 26.09.2025 to furnish fixed security deposit worth Rs. 01 Crores for a period of five year in favor of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine. In response of the same you have furnished the fixed security deposit amount worth Rs. 01 Crores in favor of the National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine through RTGS payment mode vide UTR no. IOBAN25263651125 dated 20.09.2025 and IOBAN25272106238 Dated 29.09.2025 and informed the same vide an email dated 29.09.2025.

**"DECISION"**

- Therefore, in accordance with concerned act and regulation Letter of Permission (LoP) is issued Bal Bhagwan Shikshan Prasarak Mandal's Dhanwantari Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, Degloor Road, Udgir, Distt.

Latur-413517(AYU0189) for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of the NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2025-26 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming and following requirements shall be fulfilled: -

- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
  - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- (6) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
  - (7) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
  - (8) **Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
  - (9) **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2025 and compliance report should be submitted to MARBISM in order to be considered for the process of the permission for the academic session 2026-2027 as per rules:**
    - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in to.
    - ii) All the requirements of minimum standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in MES (Assessment & Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
    - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
  - (10) The College administration shall ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of the 1<sup>st</sup> batch of student in the 1<sup>st</sup> professional of BAMS is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
  - (11) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
  - (12) This permission to **increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 to 100 seats from the academic session 2025-26** as stated above for the first admitted batch of 2025-26 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the College authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under Section 35 of the NCISM Act 2020.
  - (13) The fulfillment of the condition given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian system of medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission matter for the academic session 2026-27.


